Our first day of Lent 2016 in Jerusalem

Ash Wednesday

On Wednesday, February 10th, we had a mass in the chapel with the contemplative and apostolic sisters, brothers and friends of Sion.

We are invited to live a beautiful time of conversion, personal and community growth. Also, Lent time invites us to go to find Jesus, His presence in our silences and our senses in this land and say like the prophet Samuel "Speak, Lord; for your servant is listening" (1 Sam 3, 10).

This year is very special to us since it is our first time here living this moment and that Pope Francis invites us to live in mercy: "Mercy is what pleases me, not sacrifice" (Mt 9, 13).
